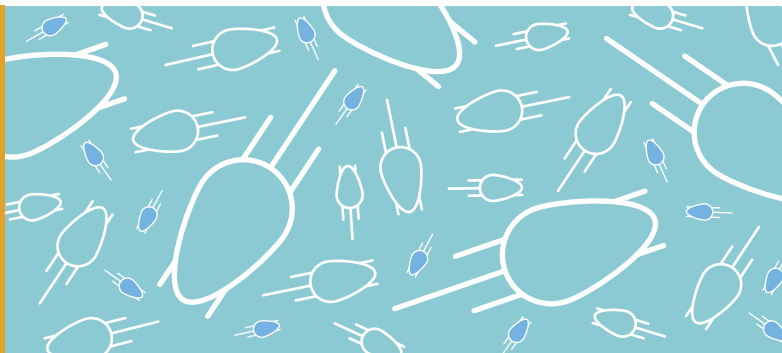

336 hours of presentations delivered

19,482 guests total

25% of programs are given on-site,
accomplishing scout badges, private
tours and up-close photo shoots.

A variety of presentations were delivered to schools, libraries, senior centers, and partner organizations such as the **Little Miami Conservancy**, the **Cincinnati Nature Center (CNC)** and **The Children's Museum**.

VOLUNTEERS & INTERNSHIPS

76 passionate and dedicated volunteers gave a total of **7,794 hours** in 2019, making a difference in the lives of raptors.

Our core teams of volunteers are education, rehabilitation, transportation and maintenance.

6 interns earned a total of **662 hours** working side-by-side with staff developing skills and gaining real-life experiences in rehabilitation and conservation.

CONSERVATION

Naturally molted feathers are collected and sent to the **National Feather Repository** to be recycled. Recycling feathers provides an alternative source to removing birds from the wild or purchasing black market feathers.



Working with the Ohio Department of Transportation, volunteers **pick up litter** from roadways to prevent raptor injuries by removing the litter they are attracted to.



RESEARCH

Specimens are donated to a local museum for study and research. Ohio rehabilitated birds are banded before release to aid in longevity and migration studies.

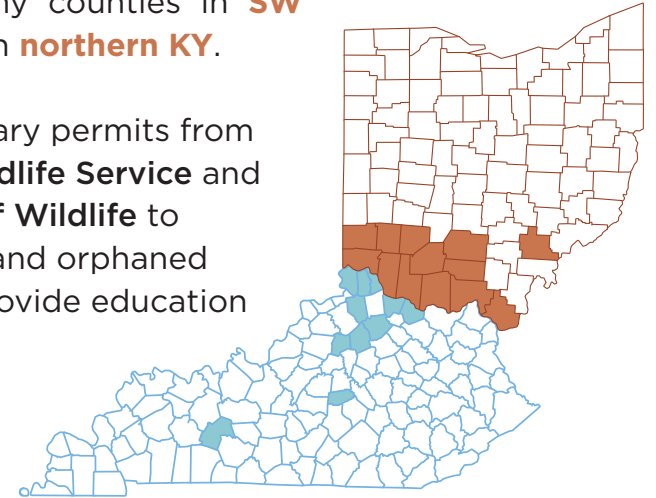

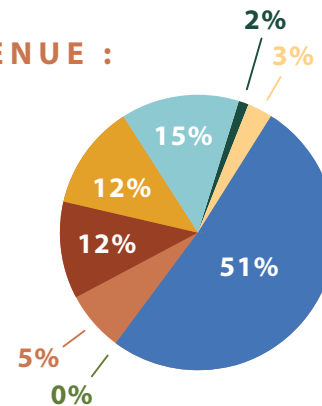


FINANCIAL REPORT

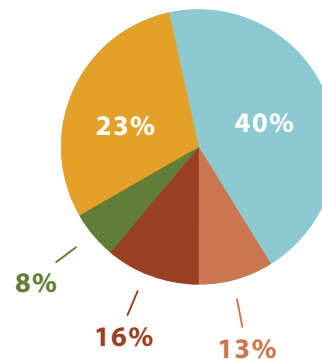
